Amea Wasson, widow of John, of Colesville (Broome) New York entered her deposition on July 4, 1839. requesting her pension. She is now 75 (born about 1764). Her husband John Wasson died on October 11, 1838. - 1839, September 17: John Turner, of Nassau (Rensselaer) New York, brother of Amea Wasson, deposes that he is aged 74 (born about 1765). That his sister was married to John Wasson at his (Turner's) father's house in the fall of (he thinks) 1780. Wasson was a soldier billeted at his father's. He made the Turners' acquaintance then, and that after he married, he lived in a house belonging to his father-in-law Turner, and continued in service, was home only for short periods when he could get leave. That he had a son named Samuel while in service. Samuel now resides in Michigan. That deponent cared for the garden for Wasson during this period. That the place where Wasson lived was at Middlefield (Middlesex) Connecticut. He deposed again on October 17, 1842 correcting his

previous deposition that he feels sure his sister Amea was married at his father's house at Middletown, Middlefield District, Connecticut, in 1782 by the Presbyterian Minister of that place.

#### John Turner and Catherine were the parents of 12 children..

John Turner was b. 23 May 1800 in the town of Nassau, Rensselaer County, New York, and was the seventh child of John Turner, who emigrated from Middletown, Connecticut, about the year 1780, with his then small family. The Turners originally emigrated from England, the place of their nativity. John, the father of our subject, reared a family of 12 children by his first wife, and three by his second; spent his days in Rensselaer County. Our subject remained with his father on the old homestead until 27 years of age; was married, February 16, 1824, to Ulissa Tiffit, b. 3 Apr 1806 in Nassau, Rensselaer Co., New York, the daughter of Robert Tiffit, of Stepentown, Rensselaer County; by this union were born four children, two of whom survive, viz.: Stephen, Robert and Phebe.

In 1827, month of February, Mr. Turner, in company with his wife, removed to Veteran Township (then Tioga County) Chemung County, coming all the way with an ox-team and sled, and located upon the farm where he now resides. Lived in a one-story log house for four years, when he erected a substantial frame house which he at present occupies. From the date of settlement has continued to improve; gotten timbers for a barn the first year; purchased, with his brother David, 160 acres. In politics Mr. Turner is Republicans; started out as a Whig, afterwards antislavery. Is a member of the Free-will Baptist Church, with which he is prominently identified; has done much towards the maintenance of the society, and contributed liberally to the church and school interests. He is also an advocate of Temperance, and has not tasted liquor in any form for more than 50 years, and never used tobacco in any form. Some 37 years ago Mr. Turner made lumber, which he used to deliver at Havana, with an ox team for four dollars per thousand. Mrs. Turner died Oct. 1, 1871, and Mr. Turner is now tenderly cared for by his son and family, they residing with him. He has been in dairy business 18 years.

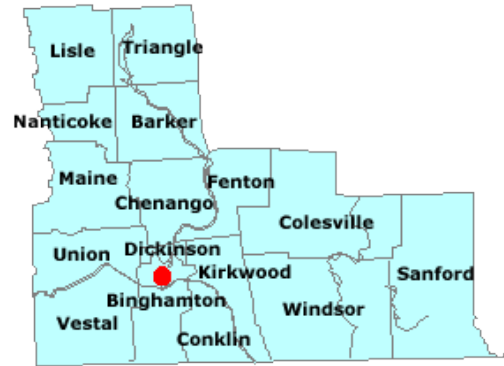

1825, February 10: A second deposition by this John gives his age as 65 (born about 1760). Probably (from these two figures) he was born between May 9, 1759 and February 10, 1760. He is a resident of Colesville (new name of Windsor) in

possession "in right of my wife" of 120 acres. There are six in his family, including wife Amea, aged 60 (born about 1765), sons John, aged 19 (born about 1806), Stephen, aged 17 (born about 1808). granddaughter Sally Randall, aged 9 (born about 1816). The sixth member of household is not named (Greene Family Bible). A pension was granted but subsequently discontinued.

1818. May 9: John Wasson applied for his pension at (Boome) New York at the age of 59 years.

1781, October: John Wasson married Amea Turner at Middletown (Middlesex) Connecticut, service performed by Rev. Mr. Benedict.

Note: There is no record of this ceremony in the records of the Congregational Church of Middletown, though the records indicate that Mr. Benedict was pastor there then. Neither is there a record of the marriage in the Middletown clerk's office.

1825: John Wasson had a wife, Amea and children at home.

That his sister was married to John Wasson at his (Turner's) father's house in the fall of (he thinks) 1780. Wasson was a soldier billeted at his father's. He made the Turners' acquaintance then, and that after he married, he lived in a house belonging to his father-in-law Turner, and continued in service, was home only for short periods when he could get leave. That he had a son named Samuel while in service. Samuel now resides in Michigan. That deponent cared for the garden for Wasson during this period. That the place where Wasson lived was at Middlefield (Middlesex) Connecticut. He deposed again on October 17, 1842 correcting his previous deposition that he feels sure his sister Amea was married at his father's house at Middletown, Middlefield District, Connecticut, in 1782 by the Presbyterian Minister of that place.

Samuel Wasson was united in marriage with Sarah Moon, daughter of Thomas Moon, a Rutland, Vermont farmer who passed his later years in Cattaraugus County, New York. Samuel and Sarah were married in Vermont and removed to New York, where they lived a number of years. Then they removed to Michigan in June, 1837, making their home on an unbroken tract of 214 acres of Unadilla Twp, Livingston County. Their log house was a distance of 1 mile from their neighbor, a Mr. Beale, who kept the post office at Plainfield. There were then no roads except as the pathway was marked out by blazed trees between this pioneer home and Dexter. Two log houses were at that time used as hotels in this vicinity one being kept by Mr. Dunn and another by Mr. Dyer. This early settler began life here with more means than many of his neighbors as he was able to pay for his and to provide himself with a team of horses and a yoke of oxen and had some money still remaining for the necessities of life. It is now thirty-five years since he passed away from this life at the age of 72 years, and his good wife who survived his for 3 years died at the same age. Of the eleven children of this worthy couple, three are now living: John, Myron, and Polly (Mrs. House). Samuel and Sarah were possessed of genuine Christian character and were charter members of the Presbyterian Church of Plainfield, where Mr. Wasson was a Deacon and Elder for many years and often supplied the pulpit by reading a sermon when no clergyman could be obtained. He was an old-line Whig and a man who was deeply interested in both temperance and education.

Clara was the daughter of Benjamin Wasson (or Wassen) and Elizabeth Hale, the sister of Emma Hale Smith. Clara was evidently a member of the Church at Nauvoo. Her brother, Lorenzo D. Wasson (1818-1857) was also a member -- he died on his way to the California gold rush. All of these persons, with the exception of J. B. Backenstos, were very likely connected with William Smith's splinter group, at Palestine, Lee Co., Illinois, during the late 1840s and early 1850s. John B. Wasson, a cousin of Clara and Lorenzo was baptized a member of the RLDS Church, in San Francisco, in 1884. Wasson, Lorenzo D. (1819-1857), son of Emma Smith's sister and brother-in-law, Elizabeth and Benjamin Wasson. Came to Illinois with his parents from Broome County, New York, in 1837. Converted to Mormonism in Illinois in 1842. Married Marietta Crocker, 1843. Appointed to the Council of Fifty, 1844. Died at Amboy, Lee County, Illinois - Hale, Isaac (1763-1839), hunter, farmer; born at Waterbury, Connecticut, and raised in Wells, Vermont. He served in the Revolutionary War. Married Elizabeth Lewis, 1789, and they became parents of nine children. Moved to Harmony, Pennsylvania, in 1791. In 1828 when persecution hampered work on the Book of Mormon in Manchester, New York, Joseph Smith continued the work under the protection of his father-in-law, Isaac Hale, in Harmony, Pennsylvania. But the following year Hale became embittered against Joseph and his work, forcing him to move to Fayette, New York. Isaac died in Pennsylvania.
